Statistics to Consider

- on Paper Consumption

- North Americans consume more paper per capita than anyone else on earth
- North American paper consumption remains a major driver of forest destruction
- 40% of the world's industrial logging goes into making paper, and this is expected to reach 50% in the near future
- Paper production is the 3rd most energy-intensive of all manufacturing industries, and is also the 4th largest emitter of greenhouse gases

Statistics to Consider

- on Paper Recycling

- Only 1/4 of Canada's waste paper and paperboard is recycled
- 77% of paper is recycled in the Netherlands and 67% of paper is recycled in Germany
- Recycled paper requires 64% less energy than making paper from virgin wood pulp.
- Recycling half the world's paper would save 20 million acres of forestland.
- Every ton of recycled paper saves about 17 trees

Facts about Junk Mail




- Junk mail in the US accounts for over 100 million pieces of mail each year about 20% of all mailed delivered in the world
- Every year, households get 848 pieces of junk mail, which requires 6.5 million tons of paper
- Approximately 44% of junk mail goes to landfills unopened

REDUCE PAPER USE - Technology can Help

- Set your margins to 'medium' or 'narrow'
- Send faxes to computers for electronic distribution
- Use electronic communication (email, websites, e-newsletters, twitter, blogs, videos, etc.)
- Set computers and photocopiers to double-sided printing as the default
- Learn how to cut and paste web pages, images, etc. into a word document, or use 'print current page' so you only print what you need
- Always use 'print preview' before you print, to double-check

REDUCE PAPER USE – A New Mindset can Help!

- Make meetings as paperless as possible save the agenda on your tablet or smartphone, send electronic copies of handouts, give out web links to articles. etc.)
- "Think before you print" to minimize photocopying
- Use individual passcodes for photocopiers
- Learn how optimize an electronic filing system for quick, easy retrieval of documents (no more binders filled with paper!)
- Support the move to paperless pay receipts, invoicing, record keeping, work orders, etc.

REDUCE PAPER USE – Change you Daily Habits!

- Use a reusable travel mug instead of paper cups. Some coffee places (e.g., Tim Horton's) give a discount!
- Reduce the use of paper cups and disposable paper plates by keeping reusable dishes in the school for meetings and events.
- Buy products with the least paper packaging. Support businesses that follow environment friendly practices. Buy recycled paper materials or materials that came from sustainable managed forests.

Teachers – You can minimize your copying!

Project your computer/tablet

to display information, worksheets, shared reading, songs, etc. on a screen instead of individual handouts

Collect back class sets

of booklets, song sheets, poems, information sheets, labs, etc. and reuse them again

Have students submit assignments electronically

using Google Classroom, etc.

Think before you laminate!

It can't be recycled and will never degrade in our landfills.

Teachers are often change facilitators and models of social consciousness for their students

Promote environmental stewardship in your day-to-day actions and teaching strategies



Promote a "Think Before You Print" Attitude

Pushing the print button is too easy...and wasteful. So the next time you are about to press that button, ask yourself the golden rule of saving paper:

"Do I really need to print this?"

Use GOOS Bins

Good On One Side paper bins

Don't recycle it yet – REUSE it first!

Use the other side of a page to make a 'to do' list, write a note, as scrap paper for calculations, or to use for artwork, etc.





Reduce first, then Reuse, and finally, Recycle...

STANDARDS OF PRACTICE

- Use an electronic filing system, not a paper one
- Set computers and photocopiers to double-sided printing as the default
- · Give staff individual passcodes for copying
- Send faxes to computers for electronic distribution
- Create paperless invoicing, record keeping, work orders, etc.
- Make meetings as paperless as possible
- Use electronic communication

If you must print...

Set margins to 'medium'

Or even narrow if is is for personal use and accessibility is not an issue.

Print Double Sided

'ts Cut your paper usage to to half!

Always check use 'print preview'

Before you hit the print button, check if you are printing what you really need.

Step One: Reduce

Is the best of the 3 R's.

Don't use up a precious resource in the first place!

Step Two: Reuse

Create a GOOS bin! (For paper that is still Good On One Side)

Step Three: Recycle

NEVER throw paper into the garbage. Recycle paper to leep it out of our landfills.
