- Outline of the Multi year plan was shared and approved by Board of Trustees in June 2022
- Multi year plan part of Education Act, must be longer than 3 years and is used as a direction for the Board,
 UGDSB has developed a 4 year plan
- Purpose to Inspire a love of learning and engage supportive learning environment
- Vision to be recognized as leaders in creating unparalleled, agile and inclusive experiences for all
- The plan to implement is broken into 4 key pillars to hold up or get to Foundation Education and Student Achievement

- These 4 pillars are what Board will need to focus on so can realize the vision in 4 years time (Lifelong love of learning, Champion health and wellbeing with particular focus on mental well being, Ensure equity of access and outcomes, lead through sustainability)
- Action plans will be developed to support and implement each element of the multi year plan
- Plans will be presented to Board of Trustees in the Fall
- Student Census was sent out to collect identity based information from students from K-12
- This is a voluntary survey
- Student Census is a key tool to help identify gaps in the Board and system and to determine what additional supports or resources are required
- Student Census template came from Ministry of Education, questions asked had to align with the curriculum and where the curriculum introduces certain topics is where related questions were asked
